Policy and Strategy Advisory

Policies become credible, implementable, and equitable models that deliver tangible impact.

- Policy-to-practice bridge: Design pathways to close the gap between ambitions, implementation, and results.
- Energy justice Integration: Embed justice and inclusion principles into strategies and implementation plans from the outset.
- Systems thinking: Align policy, finance, and stakeholders to avoid siloed interventions.

Program and delivery model design

Programs, governance models, and business models can be financed and adopted while remaining aligned with energy justice principles.

- Just transition focus: Design initiatives, funding windows, and portfolios so that justice principles are built into objectives, eligibility, decision-making, and delivery models.
- Financing alignment: Structure solutions that align with public, philanthropic, and impact-focused funding priorities.
- Cross-sectoral insights: Bridge policy, market, institutional, and community realities within a single implementation framework.

Facilitation, governance, and change management

Projects gain legitimacy, reduce implementation risks, and build lasting governance structures.

- Systems alignment: Design governance frameworks that connect policy, finance, markets, and communities.
- Trusted facilitation: Act as a bridge-builder between donors, investors, governments, and local stakeholders.
- Change management: Turn potential resistance into co-creation opportunities and implementation-focused solutions.

Learning and scaling

Turn implementation experience into learning that strengthens programs, informs policy, and supports scaling.

- Impact & equity metrics: Integrate justice and system indicators into learning and reporting.
- Adaptive learning frameworks: Create mechanisms that prioritize iteration, adaptation, and scaling and connect implementation experience back to policy and investment decisions.
- Scaling and replication pathways: Adapt successful approaches across geographies, sectors, and technologies.

Capacity building and knowledge sharing

Organizations know how to operationalize energy justice commitments through governance, participation, program design, and implementation.

- Applied training: Build capacity to apply energy justice, implementation principles in everyday work and to work across silos. Leverage existing projects to turn learning into practical tools and approaches.
- Cross-context replication: adapt lessons from other regions and sectors to local contexts, supporting teams to innovate without importing models blindly.
- Change management: pair advisory work with mentoring and peer learning so foster communities of practice that support innovation and problem-solving.
